Issues Raised by Trawden Forest Parish Council

Thank you for your email dated 3 July 2024, on behalf of Trawden Forest Parish Council, regarding their concerns about several highway issues within the parish. Angie Ridgwell, Chief Executive, has asked me to respond on her behalf.

You have raised a number of issues, which I will address in turn.

1. I am sorry to hear of the lack of an update regarding the installation of double yellow lines at Hollin Hall. There has been a protracted discussion on the request for waiting restrictions along Hollin Hall, Slack Booth and Lane House Lane.

The enclosed plans will be formally sent to the parish council in the next few days for their consideration. If the parish support the proposal, then it will go forward to an informal consultation with local residents. The plans are the result of discussions between Trawden Forest Parish Councillors, County Council Traffic and Safety Officers and engineers from Pendle Borough Council.

2. The request for further parking restrictions on Church Street and also Bank Street which leads to Boulsworth Drive have been considered and we agree that the area would benefit from our intervention. The proposed restrictions for these roads are included in the enclosed plans.
3. The wall on Trawden Road near to Spring Garden Villas will be inspected. We will carry out appropriate repairs or, if the wall is privately maintained, we will discuss the concerns with the landowner and ask them to undertake the necessary remedial works.
4. The leak at the water trough on Gladstone Terrace has been investigated. We are aware of some root ingress into the pipes servicing the trough which is causing water to discharge. Works are planned shortly to cut the roots and repair the pipes which should prevent water from flowing onto the nearby carriageway.

5. We have inspected the dry-stone walls on Coal Pitt Lane and agree that they would benefit from repair. The wall is privately maintained, and we are currently trying to identify the landowners to enable us to discuss the required works. Unfortunately, HM Land Registry are unable to provide the information online and we await delivery of their printed copies. Once received, we will contact the landowners without delay.
6. The land at the end of Trawden Road is owned by the county council and utilised by the Highways Service as a storage depot. Following consultation with our Asset Management and Highways Services, I must advise that the parcel of land cannot be made available to residents for parking at this time.
7. I understand that Tim Blythe, Countryside Service, has written to the parish council directly about the Aisled Barn at Wycoller to respond to your request for a schedule of repairs.
