David Barritt contacted Jean Driver who led the Carols at the Centre. Unsure if there was any singing on the way down – the children behind me were very excited.

Adele contacted Rev Andy Froud who led the event at the Centre.

Barry made sure tree was up by end of last week of November

David Barritt contacted Father Christmas (Alan Hardacre)

Ann Holmes was the nominated First aider.

Adele supplied barriers for around bottom of Christmas Tree, once lights are on.

Adele contacted Trawden Arms to inform them of date.

Adele/Philippa tried to source a donkey but to no avail. Philippa advises that one resident will see if they can assist next year.

The Tram Track Risk Assessment was completed and deemed safe – no reports of incidents or injuries.

Adele and Craig made a plunger – seemed to go down well.

For 2025

- Can we source some portable light sticks for the front and rear of the parade?
- Many children were not supervised. A more formal structure for the parade needs to be organised on the night, with the adult choir being behind the first marshal.
- Should we formalise a Mary, Joseph, shepherds etc?
- Need more song sheets.

Suggestions from SCP

- Start a little earlier?
- Get the real, organ carol music to play, rather than those cinematic, whooshy stuff that isn't the real tune, as it was really difficult to sing to
- Consider working with the school to do a pre-event lantern making workshop, as lanterns would be so much nicer than torches/mobile phone lights this would also be publicity for the event. NB: These would need to be bright enough so people can actually see where they are going as the Tram Tracks are not lit.
- Consider whether it would be possible for the hot drinks/mince pies could also be served outside during the carol element. (would need to check liabilities with the Trustees).
- Get actual donation buckets so the crowd outside can be milked for cash many people did not come inside.
