

Areas of Responsibility for Ball Grove

Trawden Forest Parish Council officially took ownership of a large part of Ball Grove Park on 1st November 2023.

There are three main contributors to the park; the Parish Council, the Grounds Maintenance Contractor and Friends of Ball Grove.

In order to establish who is responsible for the different areas of maintenance, the Parish Council Clerk has drawn up the table below. The Parish Council is responsible for the tender for grounds maintenance and tree works required on the park. If any issues are identified by any member of Friends of Ball Grove, this needs to be directed to the Parish Council Clerk who will decide how to deal with it. If necessary, the issue will be raised with the Parish Council at the next available meeting where the Councillors will decide how to resolve the issue. Members of Friends of Ball Grove should not contact the Grounds Maintenance Contractor direct to raise an issue with them, unless it is outside of the Parish Council owned area. A map of the area can be found in Appendix 1.

If Friends of Ball Grove have ideas that they would like the Parish Council to consider, these must be put in an email and sent to the Parish Council Clerk so that they can be added to the next available Parish Council meeting agenda for decision by Councillors. Friends of Ball Grove should not carry out any 'new' works where it incurs cost to the Council or where there is a change to the site without prior permission from the Parish Council.
